

Obituary for The Rev. Dr. C. David Hess

The Rev. Dr. C. David Hess passed away March 7, 2014 after a few weeks hospitalization in the Wilmont Cancer Center, Strong Memorial Hospital, from lung cancer. His courage and faith inspired staff and visitors alike.

Born May 31, 1949 in Charleston, West Virginia, he was a graduate of Berea College and received a Master of Divinity and a Doctor of Ministry from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. While in seminary, he pastored the Mt. Herman Baptist Church in Katawa, Kentucky. Subsequently, he served the Glenwood Baptist Church in New Jersey, the First Baptist Church in Hamilton, New York, and for 16 years the West Henrietta Baptist Church in New York, the longest pastorate in this nearly 200 year old congregation. Much loved and respected by his congregation and a wide circle of friends and acquaintances, he was active in the work of the American Baptist Churches of Rochester and Genesee Region and in many other local and statewide organizations for instance, serving as chaplain of the West Henrietta Fire Department for several years. His love of music was widely recognized both within his congregation and also by his active role in the Eastman Rochester Chorus.

Preceded in death by his mother Othell Hess, and niece Jill Hess, he is survived by his father Charles E. Hess, brother Gary (Marsha,) nephew Chad Hess (Tiffany,) niece Jan Miller (Derek,) great niece Lacey, great nephews Sawyer, Charlie and Waylon, and beloved dog Buster.

A memorial service will be held at the West Henrietta Baptist Church, 5660 West Henrietta Road, West Henrietta, NY 14586, on Sunday, March 16, at 3 pm.
